**JULY DAIRY PROS ADDRESSES RELATIONSHIP BUILDING IN CHALLENGING TIMES**

Dr. Robert Milligan from Dairy Strategies to Lead Discussion

**Harrisburg** – The July series of Dairy PROS meetings will provide dairy sales and service professionals some tools to help build stronger relationships with their dairy farm customers and clients during challenging times.

Dr. Robert Milligan, consultant for Dairy Strategies, a dairy business management company in Bruce, Wis., will lead the discussion hosted by the Center for Dairy Excellence and Penn State Dairy Alliance.

Dairy PROS is a new initiative exclusively for professionals who work in lending, accounting, feed and nutrition, veterinary, pharmaceutical, extension, genetics and other areas of the dairy industry to provide services to producers.

“The relationships dairy farm families have with their nutritionist, veterinarian, dairy equipment salesperson, and other service providers often are as important to them as the products and services they receive from these individuals,” said John Frey, executive director of the Center for Dairy Excellence. “That’s why relationship building skills are a key requirement for any job position in the dairy industry.”

Four Dairy PROS meetings are slated the week of July 19. Each meeting will feature Milligan’s “Building the Client Relationship in Challenging Times” presentation to help dairy professionals hone coaching techniques and skills to provide clients with the tools and support needed. Participants will have the opportunity to share ideas and join in the discussion.

As senior consultant for Dairy Strategies, Milligan focuses on farm and small business management, with an emphasis on human resource management and leadership development.

Each Dairy PROS meeting will also include a “Take it to the Farm” session that explains how to use the PA Dairy Tool to identify bottlenecks on the farm.
