*Each issue of "Dairy Week in Review" will report on current "Milk Margin," or the dollars remaining per one hundred lbs. of milk after feed is paid for, based on data for a 65-pound herd in the latest "PA Dairy Industry Performance Scorecard."

- Total US milk production climbed 3 percent year over year to 18 billion pounds in November, with production per cow up 2.3 percent or 43 pounds, marking the largest milk yield increase since 2016. The nation's dairy herd also expanded, up 62,000 head from a year ago to 9.41 million head, 12,000 more than in October.
- All eight top producing dairy states saw increases in milk production, with California up 2.6 percent, Wisconsin up 2.7 percent, Idaho up 2 percent, and New York up 2.5 percent. Texas continues to see substantial gains, up 9.8 percent from a year ago, while Michigan was up 3.6 percent and Minnesota was up 3.9 percent. Pennsylvania was up 0.9 percent to 815 million pounds, with 3,000 fewer cows. Milk production per cow in the Commonwealth increased 1.5 percent. Minnesota's increase in both cow numbers and milk per cow pushed the state past Pennsylvania for the month of November.
- Europe's milk production is also climbing, up 1.2 percent in October and up 1.3 percent year-to-date. An increasing milk supply, both domestically and globally, continues to put pressure on milk prices into 2021.

Government and Industry:

- Congress has passed and President Trump is expected to sign two major funding bills that will provide additional relief to the dairy community. Some of the benefits include additional agricultural support payments. The agriculture sector will receive \$13 billion in funding. Most of that sum is allocated for the Agriculture Secretary to provide support to agricultural producers. The relief measure also establishes Supplemental Dairy Margin Coverage payments for smaller farms whose production history is below five million pounds, but whose actual production has increased since 2014.
