Pennsylvania's Dairy Farmers:





- Dairy is the economic driver for Pennsylvania agriculture, the number one industry in the state.
- Pennsylvania is home to more than 7,200 dairy farms – the second most of any state in the U.S. – and 535,000 dairy cows.
- These cows produce more than 1.3 billion gallons of milk annually – enough to supply everyone in the five largest U.S. cities with all their dairy needs.
- The milk produced in Pennsylvania generates \$2 billion in on-farm income and \$6 billion in economic revenue.
- Every nine dairy cows create one job, with Pennsylvania's dairy industry supporting more than 60,000 jobs across the state.

Caring for our Animals

 Dairy farmer's commitment to providing highquality milk begins with taking good care of their cows.

Dairy farmers provide their animals with a well-balanced diet, a clean and comfortable place to live, and regular health care.

 Many farmers are participating in animal welfare certification programs to demonstrate their commitment to quality animal care.

Recharging the Environment

- Pennsylvania's dairy farms provide wide open spaces to clean and recharge water and air supplies for neighboring communities.
- Wind, solar and methane energy can all be sourced from dairy farms to replace non-renewable sources of energy.
- Dairy farm families strive to meet and exceed environmental guidelines to protect our air, land and waterways.

- A 100-cow dairy farm = \$1.37 million
- A 300-cow dairy farm = \$4.12 million
- A 500-cow dairy farm = \$6.86 million

Refueling the Economy

- As one of the largest dairy states in the East, Pennsylvania helps other states in the region make up for their milk and dairy product shortages.
- As milk moves out of Pennsylvania, more money comes back into the state's economy. Roughly 85 percent of a dairy farm's income is spent locally.

Feeding Our Community

- The 2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommend three servings of lowfat or fat-free dairy products. Dairy's powerful package of calcium and eight other nutrients fuels the body and helps build stronger bones.
- We are fortunate to have an abundant supply of fresh, high quality dairy foods produced right here in Pennsylvania.
- Chances are the milk you purchase in Pennsylvania whether at a grocery store or a farm market – came from a farm less than 100 miles from the store.
