CENTER FOUNDATION AND DAIRYMEN'S AWARD SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS *\$30,000 awarded for undergraduate education scholarships*

Harrisburg, Pa. – The Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation and Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association selected ten undergraduate students as recipients of the 2018 Student Leader Scholarship awards. Each of the recipients will receive a \$3,000 scholarship to support their undergraduate studies to pursue a career in the dairy industry.

"We are eager with the overall quality of this year's applicants, and these ten individuals exemplify the caliber of leaders we need as dairy's next generation here in Pennsylvania," said Jayne Sebright, executive director of the Center for Dairy Excellence.

Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association Executive Director David Smith adds, "The Dairymen's Association is committed to helping our future dairy leaders develop skills and education to positively impact our state's dairy industry. We look forward to seeing the future accomplishment of this outstanding group of students."

This scholarship was designed to recognize, encourage and financially assist superior students enrolled in dairy related academic programs. Eight of the scholarships have been generously funded by the Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association, with the other two funded by the Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation.

This year's recipients include:

Abby Sterner, who is a senior studying dairy science at Delaware Valley University. Growing up on a dairy farm of Brown Swiss cows, Abby is the daughter of Karen and Jonathan Sterner of Barto, Montgomery County. This summer, she is interning on Brook-Corner Holsteins through the Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation On-Farm Internship Program. Abby plans to use the experiences she gains on her internship to pursue her future career goal as a dairy herd manager and continue raising and showing Brown Swiss from her family's farm. As an FFA member and 10-year 4-H member, Abby also plans to give back to 4-H and hopes to someday become a 4-H leader to help others have an incredible 4-H experience like she had growing up.



Danielle Varner, who is a senior studying dairy science at Delaware Valley University. Growing up on a 330 milking-cow dairy farm, Danielle is the daughter of Dean and Donna Varner of Shirleysburg, Huntingdon County. Danielle has been a past On-Farm Intern through the Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation On-Farm Internship Program and takes pride in her leadership roles at Delaware Valley University as the Dairy Society President and the upcoming 4-H/FFA Dairy Judging Contest Co-Chair. Upon graduation, Danielle plans to pursue a career as a calf/heifer herdsman and continue her passion for promoting the dairy industry by becoming one of the chair members for the PA Ayrshire Association.

Drew Walton, who is a junior studying animal science at The Pennsylvania State University. Growing up on the Walton Farm of 850 milking-cows, Drew is the son of Matthew and Shala Walton of Cochranville, Chester County. Drew is heavily involved at Penn State as a volunteer at the Animal Science Lab, a member of the Dairy Science Club and a member of the Reproduction Research Team. Though research is not his end goal, he considers the opportunity to work in research as a once-in-a-life time opportunity, hoping to one day take what he learns and conduct his own research on his family farm.
