Dairy Producers and Industry Professionals Are Invited to Free Roundtable Meetings in November

Harrisburg, Pa. - Dairy producers and dairy industry professionals are invited to one of six free roundtable meetings being held across Pennsylvania this November. Hosted by the Center for Dairy Excellence in partnership with the Penn State Extension Dairy team, the events will be focused on business planning for dairy operations. Attendees will receive a business planning template and learn the steps involved in developing a plan.

"A well-written business plan can help dairy producers identify their goals and get the entire family and team members on the same page in executing this plan," said Zach Myers, Risk Education Manager at the Center for Dairy Excellence. "We hope you'll join us for a roundtable meeting happening near you. Whether you manage a dairy operation or work with dairy clients, our goal is to provide you with a business planning template, discuss the steps involved in developing a plan, and help you create a roadmap for decision making."

"Writing out a formal business plan is the only way to hold yourself accountable. It gives you grounding. It's written. It's not subject to the history of interpretation. It's not a conversation you had at 5 a.m. in the barn," said Jason Frye of Pleasant Lane Farms in Westmoreland County, Pa., who started a business plan after receiving a Transformation Team Grant through the Center. "A business plan makes it very clear what your plans and goals are. It doesn't have to be complex. It can be two to three pages long. It allows you to benchmark yourself in a very honest fashion."
