2020 Dairy Export Results: 2020 was certainly a year for the record books. Unfortunately, not all the records are things we want to remember. Record volatility in Class III and Class IV led to record low producer price differentials (PPD) in the Mideast and Northeast Milk Marketing Orders, the two orders found in Pennsylvania. In July, the Mideast order hit a low of -\$8.02 per cwt while the Northeast hit a low of -\$5.46 per cwt. December PPDs returned to somewhat normal amounts at \$1.18 and \$1.54, respectively. However, not all 2020 dairy news was bad. Block cheddar cheese price set a record high, settling at over \$3.00 per pound at one point before moderating and dropping along with Class III price later in the year. Retail sales of fluid milk grew year-overyear for the first time in recent history, showing a 2% improvement over 2019. A large reason why milk prices did not drop any further was dairy exports.

While 2020 was a difficult year for many dairy farmers across Pennsylvania and the U.S., the year ended with excellent news relative to U.S dairy exports. 2020 set a record in milk solids equivalent (MSE) volume. U.S. dairy suppliers exported a total of 2.1 million metric tons (MT) MSE, surpassing the previous record set in 2014. Total dairy exports were equal to 16.0% of total annual production. This is equivalent to 1.1 days of total national production exported each week. Unfortunately, export value did not set a record but did become the fourth year to surpass \$6 billion. At \$6.6 billion, 2020 estimated export value was the third highest annual total behind 2014 (\$7.1 billion) and 2013 (\$6.7 billion). It was ahead of 2019's fourth highest total (\$6.0 billion) by 8.5%

In recent history, cheese exports have been a big driver for increased export volume each year. However, total 2020 cheese exports declined slightly compared to 2019. The drop in cheese exports was largely driven by the increased domestic cheese price and major declines in cheese exports to Mexico. Cheese demand fell sharply in Mexico as its citizens dealt with the COVID-19 pandemic. However, cheese export increases to several Asian countries, including Prices change daily. South Korea, Japan, Indonesia and others nearly made up for the decrease in exports to Mexico. The increase to Asia nearly kept annual cheese exports flat with 2020 cheese exports only

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declining 341 MT (0.1%) compared to 2019.

U.S. milk powders accounted for the main growth areas for the 2020 export volume record. Skim milk powder/nonfat dry milk, dry whey products. milk protein concentrate, and casein all made gains ranging from 15.2% for casein up to 23.9% for dry whey products compared to 2019. Butterfat made a respectable gain of 7.0% and infant formula exports rose 2.0%. In addition to cheese, other products losing volume compared to 2019 include lactose. whole milk powder, evaporated/condensed milk, and fluid milk/cream.

2020 was not a fun year for many dairy farmers across Pennsylvania and the rest of the country. However, there were some silver linings to be found. In 2017, the U.S. Dairy Export Council (USDEC) announced its "The Next 5%" plan that was a lofty goal of growing exports from 15% of U.S. production to 20% of U.S. production. Although that goal has not been met, 2020 exports at 16% of total production were the highest since the plan was released. It is a small step, but | 2020 Export Year End Performance (Source: USDEC)
