JUNE DAIRY MONTH: June 2022 marks the 86th year that the annual June Dairy Month has taken place. June Dairy Month has an interesting history. It was actually started by a group of retail stores in 1937 in an attempt to help promote and stabilize the market in what was then a time of peak milk production that generally caused dairy farmers' pay price to drop. Fluid milk sales made up two-thirds to three-quarters of milk sales back then. So, the retailer group promoted the health benefits of fluid milk to consumers to encourage them to purchase more milk.

Peak milk production coincided with peak grass growth back when the U.S. dairy industry relied more on grazing than it does today. This occurred in June across much of the country. Peak milk production in the U.S. happens a little earlier now than it did 80-plus years ago in April or May, and fluid milk sales have inverted and are now only about one-third of total dairy sales. However, the reason June Dairy Month was created over 86 years has not changed. June Dairy Month still exists to educate the American consumer and encourage them to purchase more milk and dairy products to support the nation's dairy farm families.

In a search of the history of June Dairy Month, I came across the following article, "June Dairy Month history...nationally," from the Dairy Star publication dated June 30, 2014. The article contains an extensive history of June Dairy Month and states that in 1937 with the title "National Milk Month," June Dairy Month got its start. In 1938, the National Dairy Council (NDC) got involved and served as the headquarters for "National Milk Month," and produced the promotion information and materials that were distributed to 6,300 retail stores and ran from June 10 to July 10 of that year. In 1939, the name was official-
