CDE DAIRY MARKETS & MANAGEMENT UPDATE

NOVEMBER: October Class III and IV prices were announced earlier this month at \$21.81 per cwt and \$24.96 per cwt, respectively. These prices likely represented the peak prices for the foreseeable future. According to futures prices at market closing on Nov. 21, Class III and IV milk prices will be lower at \$21.02 and \$23.35, respectively, beginning this month and will fall through next spring before marginally improving and leveling out in the low \$20 range for Class III. A steeper decline for Class IV could result in prices in the mid- to upper \$20 range

through next summer and early fall.

An improving milk supply in the U.S. and Europe is partially responsible for the current downturn. Although holiday buying is bolstering domestic demand now through part of December, that demand is expected to drop sharply after the holiday season is over. However, bolstered by better-than-expected cheese sales domestically and abroad, the 12-month average Class III milk price was able to show a slight improvement over the end of October. As of Nov. 21, the Class III 12-month average is \$20.33 per cwt, 27 cents more than one month ago. Class IV milk price loses \$1.86 between now and December, falling from \$23.35 to \$21.49 per cwt and then dropping another 69 cents by January before stabilizing. As of Nov. 21, the Class IV 12-month average is \$20.81 cents per cwt, 59 cents less than at the end of October.

The U.S. dairy cow herd increased by 31,000 head year-over-year (YOY) to 9.418 million. This is also 1,000 cows from October. Total milk production was up YOY for the 4th consecutive month because of increased cow numbers and more milk production per cow. The average cow produced 2,001 pounds during October, 17 pounds more than she did last year. Both factors contributed to a 1.2% increase (+227 million pounds) in total milk production, or 18.850 billion pounds total.

For the 3rd consecutive month, Pennsylvania was able to maintain its herd size of 468,000 cows. This is about 0.4% lower (-2,000 head) YOY. Fortunately, Pennsylvania's dairy cows were more productive this October compared to last. The average cow in the Commonwealth produced 1,765 pounds of October milk. This represents a 1.4% increase (+25 pounds) that was able to overcome the YOY reduction in cow Prices change daily. 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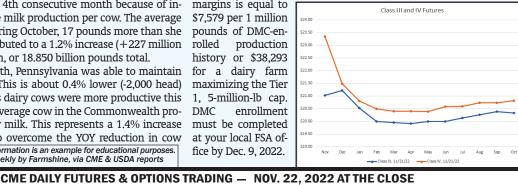

was up 0.5%). Total milk production across the state was up 1.0% to 826 million pounds, which is 8 million pounds more than Oct. 2021.

Despite converging U.S. and international dairy product prices, combined with a very strong dollar compared to international currencies, dairy exports remain on track to set volume and value records in 2022. According to the U.S. Dairy Export Council (USDEC), September exports were up 7% YOY to 199,804 metric tons (MT). Exports of whey, cheese, lactose, and butter continued to offset nonfat dry milk/skim milk powder (NDM/SMP) export declines to keep YOY export growth positive. Sept. NDM/SMP exports posted the 10th consecutive YOY decline, Export value at over \$780 million is up more than 20% YOY.

There are currently two more weeks to enroll in the Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) program for 2023. Based on the online DMC Decision Tool last updated on Nov. 17, indemnities are expected each month next year. The DMC feed cost is expected to average \$13.62 per cwt while the U.S. all-milk price is expected to be \$22.15. This gives an average DMC margin of \$8.53 -- 97 cents less than the \$9.50 maximum margin coverage allowed. The theoretical net benefit based on these margins is equal to

\$7,579 per 1 million pounds of DMC-enproduction rolled history or \$38,293 a dairy farm for maximizing the Tier 5-million-lb cap. DMC enrollment must be completed at your local FSA office by Dec. 9, 2022.
