DE DAIRY MARKETS & MANAGEMENT UPDATE

2020

APRIL: As we deal with continued market volatility as a result of COVID-19, here is how current milk prices and March production numbers were reported. The major impact as a result of COVID-19 is expected to be much more pronounced when April numbers start being reported in early May.

Class III and IV futures continued their downward trends this month. The Class III price for the next 12 months now averages \$14.45. This is a decline of \$1.45 since this time last month. Average Class IV price is \$12.63, a \$2.28 drop since last month. Details are not yet available on how direct payments announced by USDA will be calculated.

March U.S. milk production was up 2.2% compared to March 2019 driven by a 0.3% increase in cow numbers and a 1.9% increase in milk production per cow. The national herd is now 9.361 million. This is 28,000 head more than last March. Dairy cow slaughter was down 4.8% to 288,000 compared to March 2018.

Pennsylvania milk production was up 2.0% from last March driven by a 4.1% increase in milk production per cow. Across all milk cows, the average Pennsylvania milk cow is producing 2.7 pounds per day more than she did last year. Cow numbers continued its year over year decrease. The Pennsylvania milk herd is down 2,2% from last year to 485,000 head.

Total export value reached nearly \$523 million in February and was 13.1% higher than last February. March numbers are expected to be significantly lower as a result of COVID-19's effect on global trading partners. February import value was up nearly 22% compared to last year at \$310 million.
