Crop Production: One thing that COVID-19 has not affected this year is Mother Nature. For much of the U.S., 2020 has had an excellent growing season, especially in the Midwest where most of the nation's corn and soybeans are grown. The Pennsylvania growing season has not been as forthcoming with rainfall as other parts of the country.

According to the United States Drought Monitor, most of the western half of the state is either abnormally dry or experiencing moderate drought conditions. The eastern half of the state is not under drought stress.

Around the 10th of each month, USDA releases its Crop Production report based on crop conditions on the first day of the month. Some extreme weather across the Midwest since the first of the month damaged some of the corn acreage that might influence the estimates next month. However, for now, this month's report is good news if you are a buyer, but not so much if you are selling.

According to the latest report, corn and soybean yields are expected to reach record highs and provide ample supply to keep feed prices down this year and next. An estimated 84.0 million acres of corn for grain were planted this year, 3% more acres compared to 2019. Corn yields are expected to reach a record high 181.8 bu/A this year. This is 14.4 bu/A more than 2019. Total corn yield is estimated at 15.3 billion bushels, 1.7 billion bushels more than last year. In Pennsylvania, an estimated 1 million acres of corn grain were planted, 60,000 acres less than 2019. Drought conditions in much of the state have lowered average yield per acre compared to last year. Corn yield is estimated to be 144 bu/A this year, down 9 bu/A compared to 2019. Total corn yield is estimated to be 144 million bushels, down 11% from 162 million bushels in 2019.

ed 83 million acres of soybeans were planted this year across the country, 8,000 acres more than 2019. Soybean yield is estimated to reach a record Prices change daily. 

Pennsylvania, an estimated 605,000 acres of soybeans were planted, about 5,000 acres less than 2019. The Pennsylvania soybean crop is expected to yield 47 bu/A, 2 bu/A less than last year. Total soybean production across the state is estimated to be 28.4 mil. bu., 1.5 mil. bu. less than 2019.

Last week, the USDA announced that the application deadline for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) direct payments would be extended to September 11, 2020. If you have already applied and received the initial 80% payment, the remaining 20% payment will start processing beginning on Aug. 17. Applications received now until the deadline will receive 100% of the payment once the application is approved. The CFAP direct payment is roughly equivalent to \$6.20 per cwt of an applicant's first quarter milk production. This is roughly \$6,200 for each 100,000 pounds of first quarter milk

production. Dairy farmers can elect to have the direct payment paid to through them their cooperative. me or your local Farm Service Agency Office for more in formation.
